More and more teachers are working at giving their students opportunities for extending learning beyond the classroom walls. What kinds of experiences are you giving your students?

Do you have students: get involved with senior citizens? exchange letters with other classes or schools? present skits of such things as their book talks to other classes? put together panel presentations for other classes within the school? share videos they have created with other classes? interest others in books they are reading by having them do book talks over the public address system? set up displays in the library? read stories they have written to students in earlier grades?
