The Heartside Neighborhood is far from well fed. As the statistics to the left and below indicate, many of its residents are impoverished and undernourished. This is due to the fact that the Heartside Neighborhood is a food desert, meaning they are without access to fresh healthy, and affordable food. This is a wicked problem in the sense that there is no easy solution. For example, adding a new supermarket could serve as a further source of gentrification in an already gentrified neighborhood.

Crowd Funding

As is inevitable, the Heartside Gleaning Initiative requires a considerable amount of funding to continue forward with their mission. Their goals are to have:


