NEW LIBRARY BOOK DEDICATED TO WILLIAM ZIMMERMAN

The book, Marines in the Revolution, by Charles R. Smith, has been donated to Zumberge Library in memory of William Zimmerman. Zimmerman, a GVSC alumnus, was killed in action last October while serving with the United States Marine Corps in Beirut, Lebanon.

Gordon C. McFadden of Wilkes Barre, Pennsylvania, donated the book to the GVSC library, a choice made by the Zimmerman family. A special presentation page inserted in the book states: "In memory of 1st Lt. William Zimmerman USMC, so you may know the first of the few good men the Marines have looked for and found since 1775." The presentation is signed by the author and by illustrator Charles H.

Waterhouse, a major in the Marine Corps.

The book, published by the U.S. Marine Corps' History and Museum Division, is a history of the continental marines in the American Revolution from 1775-1783.
