EASTER DAY FESTIVAL IN ANN ARBOR APRIL 10

Five poets from Detroit, Alma, North Muskegon, Milwaukee, and South Carolina will highlight the sixth and final Easter Day OUT OF TOWNERS POETRY SERIES beginning at 2 pm in the Pendleton Arts Room, Michigan Union, U of M campus at Ann Arbor.

The reading/performance and "early May Day poetry festival," billed by the coordinators as the biggest Michigan poetry event of the spring, is expected to draw over 100 poets, writers, and poetry afficianados from southeastern Michigan and northwest Ohio.

Opening the "spring rite" poetry festival will be Dick Bakken who has just completed work as poet-in-residence with the North and South Carolina Poetry in the Schools Projects. Bakken has worked in Michigan as a poet, teacher, and arts administrator with the Thomas Jefferson College. While here he co-organized the 1975 National Poetry Festival and the Poetry Resource Center.

Judith McCombs, the festival's second reader, teaches literature and creative writing at the Center for Creative Studies, a Detroit arts college. <u>Sisters and Other Selves</u>, her first collection of poems, was published in 1976 by the Glass Bell Press, Detroit's poetry press for women.

Judith Minty, third reader in the Easter Day Poetry Festival, is the recipient of the U.S. Award given by the International Poetry Forum for her book Lake Songs and Other Fears. The Lake Michigan and northern woods poet is now working as a poet, writer, and advisor with the Michigan Council for the Arts. For the past two years she has been a featured poet at the National Poetry Festival, the Michigan Poetry Conference, and the Poetry Resource Center.

Tom Montag, fourth reader in the festival, lives in Fairwater, Wisconsin (north of Milwaukee) where he edits <u>Margins: A Review of</u> Little Magazines and Small Press Books.

Jim Tipton, resident poet at Alma College, is the fifth and final poet of the Easter Day Festival. With Herb Scott and Conrad Hilberry, he edited the new collection of poetry from Michigan published by Wayne State Press, Third Coast.
