United Way Campaign Results

Grand Valley faculty and staff contributed \$16,015 toward the 1984 United Way Campaign. That represents a three percent increase over last year's total contributions.

United Way Campaign Chairman Arthur C. Hills expresses his appreciation to the 37 building captains who solicited contributions. He noted the average contribution this year was \$58.66. Seventy-one percent of the contributors chose payroll deduction as their method of giving.

Hills announced that Lake Huron Hall achieved the highest average contribution at \$99.17 per contributor. Building captains were Dick Mehler and Vonnice Herrera. Coming in second in the building by building comparison was Loutit Hall with an average per capita contribution of \$91.76. Loutit Hall building captains were Tom Hendrix and Dan Andersen.

United Way funds raised at GVSC are divided between Kent and Ottawa counties with 56% of the total going to Kent and 44% to Ottawa County.

Ardith DenBesten was secretary for this year's campaign, Jean Waldo was treasurer, and Sharon Coeling handled publicity.
