The instructor likes that their current text is an anthology as it provides a variety of voices, but the anthology also limits what can be included semester by semester. Open educational resources that require few changes are desired and the instructor wants a more dynamic collection of resources so that readings can be more easily changed.

Search Notes

The search consulted OER commons, Pressbooks, Open Textbook Library, OpenStax, and Merlot. The results were surprisingly limited with just a few specific OER texts published for gender studies. Since this is a readings-focused class and the instructor would like a variety, a course specific reader could easily be compiled out of existing OER and appropriately licensed readings. All listed options will permit the instructor to pick and choose specific readings to pull



for the course with some exceptions if there is a desire to create a compiled course specific textbook of readings. Additionally, many readings that would round out the course will likely be free for students to read through either online newspapers/magazines or the Library, but won't be included in CC-licensed open education materials.

Gap Analysis

There are a few strong OER textbooks focused on gender studies. However, there is room for more development of OER for this discipline, particularly for collected readings.

 for the gender studies field. The OER is organized in five units with focus on introducing
 the theoretical frameworks and concepts firs tot students, then challenging constructs,
 discusses institutions and instructors, gender and work in the global economy, and then
 ending with feminist social movements. This textbook can be applied as the main class
 textbook, or specific chapters pulled as readings.
