HOUSING RESERVATIONS -- A reminder to you students who plan to live in the Grand Valley Apartments next fall ... please return your housing applications right now. If you have not received your application, write the Office of Admissions.

SUMMER SESSION -- Information on the summer quarter at GVSC will be published later this month. Courses offered will include several in English ... French, German, and Spanish ... fine arts ... economics ... history ... philosophy ... political science ... biology ... math ... and physics.

Summer on the campus should be a delightful experience ... where students, when they are not enjoying the scenic outdoors, can be studying in air-conditioned comfort. Year-round education is the plan of Grand Valley ... students are urged to take advantage of the opportunity. Or why not come in summer and take a winter quarter off ... for work or skiing?

MISSING: A GVSC MASCOT -- Student government has decided to give a \$25 prize to the person who names the mascot for GVSC. Suggestions from the public are welcome ... and the field is open. Anything from aardvark to zebra will be considered ... but keep in mind that GVSC is a Michigan college and its colors are black, blue, and white. ExCo will narrow down the entries to six ... then hold an election so that the student body can choose from the six the symbol for Grand Valley. Deadline for all entries is April 5 ... the election will take place April 12.

THE USES OF TELEVISION -- One of the busiest men on campus is Dave Doebel, A-V assistant. Dave rides herd on the audio-video system, which now includes an impressive television installation. Two lecture halls ... four classrooms ... and 18 study carrels ... are now connected to a central TV distribution system. Professors can call for TV to use in their classes ... and students can study programmed video material. Some 50 hours of video tape is on hand ... with more added every day, including that prepared by members of our faculty. Plans call for expansion of the system to additional classrooms in Lake Huron Hall.

Students in pysch class have had a novel assignment ... instead of handing in a paper they were requested to prepare a video or audio tape as their outside preparation ... to be reviewed and graded by Professor Frase.

Math and chemistry faculty have starred in tapes of experiments and supplemental material. Seven channels can be in operation simultaneously ... including commercial and closed circuit programs.

EDUCATION IN INDIA -- Dr. Eugene Ten Brink, a staff member of Bangalore University, spoke to students on campus recently on the problems

of higher education in India ... compared to which our own problems here in America seem small indeed.

"BREWSIE AND WILLY" -- is the name of the play Les Visages ... fresh from its successful presentation of "The Lady's Not for Burning" ... has scheduled for Arts on Campus. The one-act play by Gertrude Stein ... a story of the physical and spiritual wounds caused by World War II ... will be given three times during the weekend.
