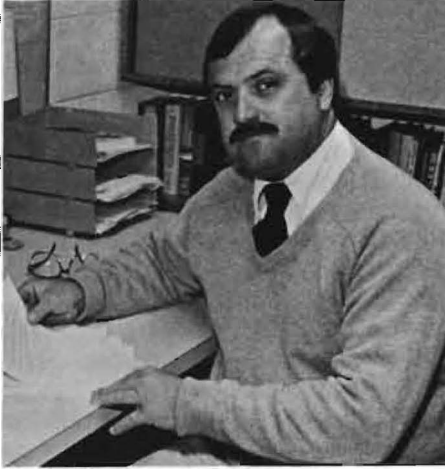

Dr. Gene Hensler joined Seidman College as Professor of Finance this fall. Dr. Hensler received his B.B.A. from Wayne State University and his M.B.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Michigan in Business Administration. From 1967 to 1970, he taught at Georgia State University in Atlanta. For the last eight years he has been an Associate Professor at the University of Toledo. Dr. Hensler has written a book, has published numerous articles, and has presented papers at several professional meetings.

He was also Assistant to the President at Leederman Elevator in Detroit from 1967 to 1970.
